Summertime Judaism by Rabbi David Widzer



It's hard to believe that summer is almost here. Yet the pace of our community's life isn't slowing down one bit this season as we create Kol Dorot and prepare for a great year.

Although religious school and many programs and classes are on summer hiatus, you might think that there isn't much to do Jewishly. Wrong! We are still your center of Jewish learning and living all year long. Here are some ideas to help enrich your summer:

1. Celebrate Shabbat at home. With more relaxed summer nights, why not invite a few friends over for a leisurely Shabbat dinner or a Saturday afternoon picnic? Take the time each week to make Shabbat a true day of rest.

2. Come to Shabbat services or Torah study. Our summertime Shabbat services begin Fridays at 6:00 p.m. Watch for information about Prayers on the Palisades, when our service is held outdoors at State Line Lookout (off the Palisades Parkway). Consider joining us for Torah study on Saturdays at 9:00 a.m. (and 9:30 a.m. starting July 6th). No experience necessary, no Hebrew required -- just an open mind and interest in seeing how Jewish texts are relevant in our lives today.

3. Attend Shabbat services in other cities. Going on a trip this summer? Check out Shabbat services at a congregation wherever you are. There are synagogues just about everywhere. (Maybe we should give a prize for the most exotic temple visited.) Ask one of the clergy ahead of time, and we'll be happy to help you make arrangements. We know people everywhere!

It's Getting Closer Every Day!

How TRULY EXCITING. Our multi-year process that has led us to redirect our future and that of Reform Judaism in Bergen County is nearly complete. We stand ready to move forward with our next chapter as Kol Dorot: A Reform Jewish Community.

Our lay leaders, staff and clergy continue to work daily on the many aspects of our merger. In recent weeks, we...

- ... selected a logo for our new community
- ... announced the board of trustees for our first year
- ... agreed upon 2019-2020 dues and religious school fees
- ... finalized clergy & staff contracts & employment agreements
- ... submitted our Certificate of Merger to the State of NJ
- ... saw our plan pass unanimously at the Oradell Zoning Board of Adjustments
- ... submitted our architect's plans to the Oradell Construction Department for permits
- ... hired a building contractor
- ... acquired the title for 660 Kinderkamack Road
- ... received pre-approval for a bridge loan to cover six months of construction

And there's much more to come. We will soon secure our demolition permit and begin the renovations as our builder moves interior walls of the existing office building to create our new house of worship. Meanwhile, both congregations will have services dedicated to honoring their respective histories on June 14 and 15 plus a shared celebration on the afternoon of June 15 as the Torahs are marched west from Closter to their temporary housing in Washington Township. On Friday, June 21, we will have our first official joint service at Kol Dorot West. And soon you will hear about our capital campaign to raise the funds necessary to build a Phase II sanctuary, making our house of worship a 365-day-a-year building and offering opportunities for naming rights to memorialize and honor our families.

This summer, all members of Temple Beth El and Temple Beth Or will automatically become members of Kol Dorot. Also this summer, Rabbi Widzer and TBE Office Manager Patsy Deonandan will join the office staff and clergy at Kol Dorot West. Early Learning Center Director Barbara Weinberg and her administrative assistant, Amy Fox, will remain at Kol Dorot East to operate the Kol Dorot Early Learning Center until we are ready to move to our Oradell location in late Fall 2019.

Our religious school kicks off the school year in its temporary location in Washington Township (registration information is now available!) In late September, we will join together to observe our High Holy Days at *Kol Dorot West*.

In November 2019, when Phase One of construction should be complete, we will close the doors of *Kol Dorot West* and march our Torahs to our new home at 660 Kinderkamack Road. Amazing!

We didn't get here by accident. Each step was made with great intention. And it's natural to be nostalgic and sad for the space we have called home for more than 50 years while also welcoming a change that helps our Reform Jewish community flourish in Northern Bergen County.

As we forge a new sacred community, we need each and every one of you to be part of it. Together, we will embrace and share in all the simchas and other lifecycle events as a larger and even more vibrant community. What an exciting time to be part of Kol Dorot!

Meet Cantor Sarah Silverberg by Marlys Lehmann



It takes talent, persuasion and patience to nurture a synagogue volunteer choir. Cantor Sarah Silverberg has done that in the five years she has been with Temple Beth Or -- and has led the religious school's junior choir as well. At this time, about 16 adults meet with her over the summer in preparation for the High Holidays.

Soon our choir may be larger, when Beth El and Beth Or merge to form Kol Dorot. Cantor Sarah looks forward to the challenge of organizing it all. Although it's a lot of music to learn and prepare, she loves how participating in the choir helps to strengthen friendships, fosters a singing community, and provides a different spiritual experience for the High Holidays.

Between chatting and joking together at rehearsals, she finds moments to talk about the spirituality behind the music the choir sings. "When we can collectively find the emotion in the liturgy we sing, the music becomes elevated to such a beautiful level and it suddenly becomes prayer," she explains. "It's an incredibly powerful moment and one of the things I look forward to most about our choir rehearsals." Each temple also currently has a band that plays several times a year at Shabbat services. Although each band brings different talent, instruments and music, they both help to infuse our Shabbat services with incredible energy.

Cantor Sarah came to Temple Beth Or in July of 2014 (at the same time as Rabbi Noah). She immediately loved the warmth of the community and the openness to trying new Jewish music, ideas and customs. Thinking ahead to Kol Dorot, Cantor Sarah is looking forward to collaborating with a new partner in music, when Jim Rensink (see interview at right) joins her. She says, "I am really excited [about the future] -- a lot of great opportunities for great music and embracing a new community. Both congregations have wonderful musical traditions. I look forward to honoring the musical legacies of both communities and beginning to create a new Kol Dorot musical tradition."

Cantor Sarah grew up outside Philadelphia in Glenside, PA. From early on, she loved singing and was involved in synagogue music; first as a toddler in Tot Shabbat, then in the children and teen choir and, after her bat mitzvah, in the High Holiday adult choir. She fondly remembers how her cantor noticed how much she loved music and encouraged her to join her on the bimah to sing frequently during Shabbat services and to chant Torah and Haftarah on Shabbat mornings. Early as it was, Sarah knew she wanted to become a cantor. Her reasons for becoming a

"The school is truly a special place", explains Leah Horesh, whose son graduates this week. (Mazel tov!) "The teachers care for the children as their own and demonstrate the utmost passion for what they do. Words can't really describe the warmth and love that radiate through the hallways and classrooms. My son has grown tremendous amounts through his three years in the school, not only academically but socially as well. Now my daughter will be starting the 2s in September, and I am so thrilled we will remain part of this community. We feel that it is not just a school, but truly an extension of our family!"

Just like his father, Alan Finkelstein's son graduated from Beth El's nursery school. "We are proud to be a second-generation family of the nursery school", says Alan and his wife Yafit, whose son graduated last year. cantor deepened further during her college summer internship at a nursing home where she sang in the dementia unit. There she saw how deeply touched and moved the residents were by the music they remembered from their youth. "I knew I wanted to become a cantor to help people connect to Judaism and their spirituality through music." Following her cantorial study at Hebrew Union College, she decided to do a year-long internship as a chaplain at the VA Hospital in Manhattan.

Her time visiting and listening to veterans and offering them spiritual and emotional support at a VA hospital deepened her sense that as a cantor she could provide not only music but also pastoral care.

Cantor Sarah lives in Waldwick with her husband, Marc, who works in investor relations, along with their nearly three year-old daughter, Maya, and the newest addition, Emma Lily, born just a few weeks ago.
