SCHEDULE NOTES

1) Shofar Kids

These are High Holy Day experiences for our youngest community members (ages 0-6) and their families. A fun, musical service is followed by hands-on holiday-themed projects.

2) Family Service

This service is welcoming and appropriate for all ages. Designed for children ages 7-12 and their families, this is a great way for multiple generations of your family to pray together.

3) Double Services

To increase our capacity, we will hold two seatings of our service for Rosh Hashanah morning, Kol Nidrei, and Yom Kippur morning. For each one, plan to attend either the "Early Service" or the "Late Service."

4) Tashlich

This year we are holding Tashlich, the ceremony of casting away our sins into flowing water, on the Sunday between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Tashlich will take place at the Skating Pond in Oradell. The entrance to the Skating Pond is on Oradell Avenue, just west of Prospect Ave. and Memorial Field.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFO

1) Member Tickets

Tickets are required for all services, except for Shofar Kids and Family Services. (Shofar Kids and Family Services are free and open to the community.) To receive High Holy Day tickets, members of Kol Dorot must have paid at least 50% of dues for 2021-2022, or a recurring payment plan must be in place. 2) Guest Tickets

Due to limited capacity, guest tickets may only be purchased by members of Kol Dorot. Each member family of Kol Dorot may request **up to two** guest tickets.
